"Straight up, we made some mistakes," began Robb, who stood by Mackey in the video released Wednesday.

In June, the Department of Consumer Affairs stated that the supermarket chain, which boasts a total of 422 stores in the United States, had been overcharging customers due to an overstated weight/price ratio when it came to certain items, including vegetables, fruit and prepackaged meat.

To register to vote in Utah, you must:

- Be a citizen of the United States
- Have resided in Utah at least 30 days immediately before the next election
- Be at least 18 years of age on or before the next election, OR
- Be 17 years of age but will be at least 18 years of age on or before the next general election

Mail-in registration instructions:

- Complete all required information; if not applicable write "N/A."
- If you have registered to vote with a different name or address, complete the change of information section.
- **One of the following is required: a Utah Driver License number, a Utah State Identification number, or the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you do not have a Utah Driver License or a Utah State Identification card, please write "None" in the space designated for a Utah Driver License or Utah State Identification and fill in the last four digits of your Social Security number.**
- Read the voter declaration and citizenship affidavit and sign and date below.

Deadline for submitting this form:

- By Mail: This form must be postmarked at least 30 days before an election to be eligible to vote in that election (see the back of this form).
- Walk In: This form must be delivered in person to your county clerk at least 7 days before the election to be eligible to vote in that election.

Please note:

- If you are qualified and the information on your form is complete, your county clerk will mail confirmation of your registration to you.
- You may apply to the lieutenant governor or your county clerk to have your entire voter registration record classified as private.
- You must present valid voter identification to the poll worker before voting, which must be a valid form photo identification that shows your name and photograph, or, (2) two different forms of identification that show your name and current address.
- For more information contact your county clerk (see the back of this form) or the Lieutenant Governor's Office at vote.utah.gov or 1-800-995-VOTE.

NOTICE: Voter registration records are considered public under Utah Code § 63G-2-301, excluding driver license or identification card numbers, Social Security numbers, email addresses, and the day of your month of birth. Preregistration records are considered private until the registrant reaches 18 years of age.

The portion of a voter registration form that lists a person's month or year of birth is a private record, the use of which is restricted to government officials, government employees, political parties or certain other persons.

In accordance with Utah code section 20A-2-401, the penalty for willfully causing, procuring, or allowing yourself to be registered or preregistered to vote if you know you are not entitled to register or preregister to vote is up to one year in jail and a fine of up to \$2,500.

Some Utah 16-year-olds sent primary election ballots by mistake

In Utah, 16- and 17-year-olds can “pre-register” to vote when they file paperwork for a driver license.

Under normal circumstances, the system tags the name as ineligible at first and then is programmed to change its status on the driver’s 18th birthday. But an error last week caused 150 new licensed drivers in several counties to be given active status right away.

“Very small glitch and I’m glad we caught it early,” said Justin Lee, the state’s director of elections.

No proof of citizenship = Vote in Federal Elections

Important Information Regarding Proof of Citizenship

A person must be a U.S. citizen in order to register and vote.

A person who submits valid proof of citizenship with his or her voter registration form (regardless of the type of form submitted) is entitled to vote in all federal, state, county and local elections in which he or she is eligible. The voter registration form otherwise must be sufficiently complete.

A person is not required to submit proof of citizenship with the voter registration form, but failure to do so means the person will only be eligible to vote in federal elections (known as being a "federal only" voter). A "federal only" voter will become eligible to vote a "full ballot" in all federal, state, county and local elections if he or she later provides valid proof of citizenship to the appropriate County Recorder's office.

Any person who is registered to vote may vote by absentee ballot (See Utah Code 20A-3-301).

How to apply for an absentee ballot:

Fill out the following application, and then mail or drop off the application to your county clerk's office. You may also request an absentee ballot online at VOTER.UTAH.GOV.

Overseas and military voters (UOCAVA voters) may electronically request an absentee ballot, receive an absentee ballot electronically, and return a completed absentee ballot electronically. Forms may be emailed to elections@utah.gov or submitted directly to your county clerk.

When to apply for an absentee ballot:

The county clerk must receive the absentee ballot application no later than the Thursday before the election. See the reverse side of this form for your county clerk's mailing address and contact information.

How to cancel an absentee ballot request:

Contact your county clerk if you no longer wish to receive absentee ballots.

All of the elections in 2016 will be conducted by mail meaning that all active voters will receive the ballot in the mail about 3 weeks before the election.

Absentee ballot applications only need to be filled out by those voters that need a ballot sent to a location other than their normal mailing address.

- Are at least 18 years of age on or before the next election*
- If you are 16 or 17 years of age, you may preregister to vote.

**A voter who is 17 years of age is eligible to participate in a Primary Election if they will turn 18 years of age on or before the date of the next General Election.*

When is the voter registration deadline?

This registration form must be received by your county clerk's office at least 11 days before the election. If this form is not received by this deadline, you may register to vote at a voting center by voting with a provisional ballot and providing two forms of identification. You can find a list of acceptable forms of identification at www.vote.utah.gov.

How will I know if my registration was processed?

Your county clerk's office will send you an official voter information card by mail within 30 days of processing your voter registration form. You can also check the status of your voter registration by visiting www.vote.utah.gov.

Is voter registration information confidential?

The list of registered voters is considered public record and available to the general public in Utah. However, Utah law grants protections to voters who wish to not have their information publicly available. "Section 10" of the Voter Registration Form allows for a voter to protect their information from certain parties, while the section below (titled "How do I request additional privacy protection?") discusses additional privacy protections that are available to certain individuals. A few items remain confidential and are never provided to any requester: your social security number, your UT Driver's License number/UT ID number, email address, full date of birth, and your signature.

How do I request additional privacy protection?

In addition to the protections outlined in "Section 10" of the Voter Registration Form, you may request that all information on your voter registration records be withheld from all political parties, candidates for public office, and their contractors, employees, and volunteers, by submitting a withholding request form, and any required verification, with this registration form, or to the Office of the Utah Lieutenant Governor or a county clerk.

Who can submit a withholding request form?

- A person who is a victim, or is likely to be a victim, of domestic violence or dating violence
- Law enforcement officers
- Individuals protected by protective or protection orders
- Members of the armed forces
- Public figures who have a higher safety risk due to their celebrity status or prominent position (does not include elected officials)
- A person who resides with a person described in the bullet points above.

You can obtain a withholding request form from your county clerk's office or the Office of the Utah Lieutenant Governor, or you may download the form online at www.vote.utah.gov.

Will I need identification to vote?

Yes, you will need to provide identification if you vote in person. If you are registering to vote for the first time and are voting by mail, you will need to provide identification to your county clerk's office.

A list of acceptable forms of identification can be found at www.vote.utah.gov.

Will I get a ballot in the mail?

If this form is received by your county clerk's office at least 11 days before an election, your county clerk's office will mail you a ballot. If you are unable to submit your registration at least 11 days before an election, you must vote at an in-person voting center.

You can find a nearby voting center on www.vote.utah.gov.

Can I register to vote if I have been arrested or convicted of a crime?

You can register to vote if you:

- Are granted parole;
- Are on probation for a misdemeanor or a felony;
- Are a pretrial detainee awaiting trial;
- Are currently in jail serving a sentence for a misdemeanor that is not related to election law; or
- Are no longer serving a term of imprisonment due to a felony or misdemeanor conviction.

How do I vote if I'm a Utah resident but live outside of the state at the time of an election?

If you are a Utah resident who is actively serving military duty or currently resides outside of the U.S., complete "Section 8" of the Voter Registration Form to be eligible to receive a ballot by fax or email. If you are a Utah resident and would prefer to not receive your ballot at your primary residence, you can obtain an "Alternate Address Request Form" online at www.vote.utah.gov and submit it to your county clerk's office. This will enable you to receive your by-mail ballot at a separate address from your primary residence.

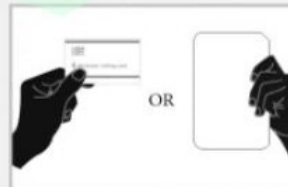

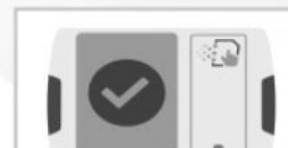

What are my rights?

As a voter, you have the right to:

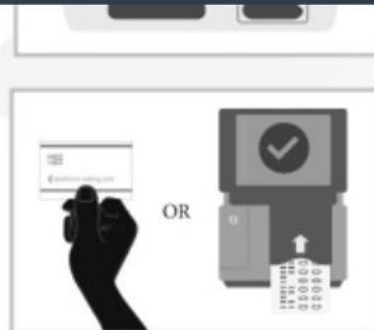

You may receive assistance from a poll worker or an individual of your choice; however, an employer, union representative, or candidate may not assist you.

- Electioneer within 150 feet of this polling location

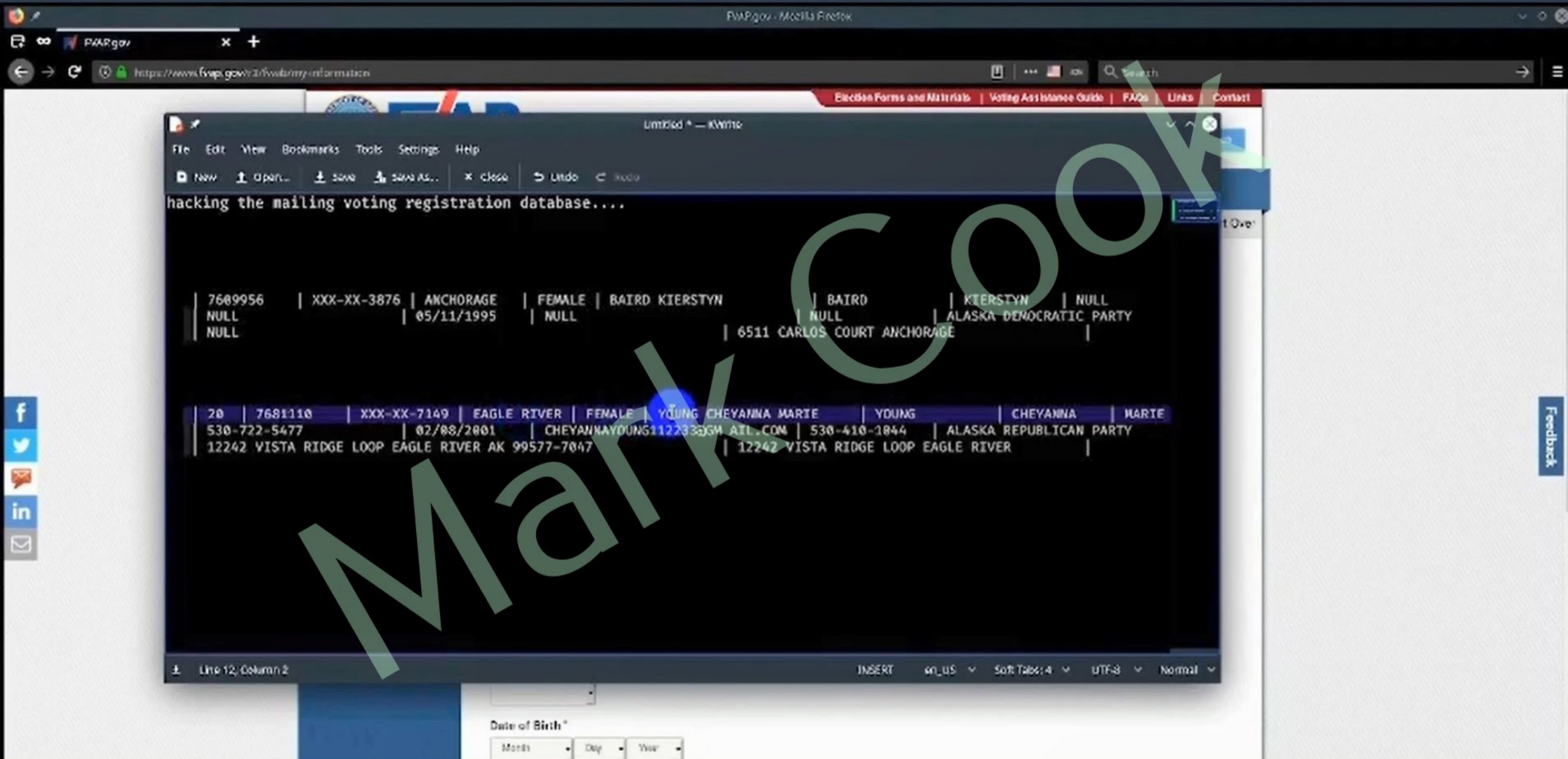

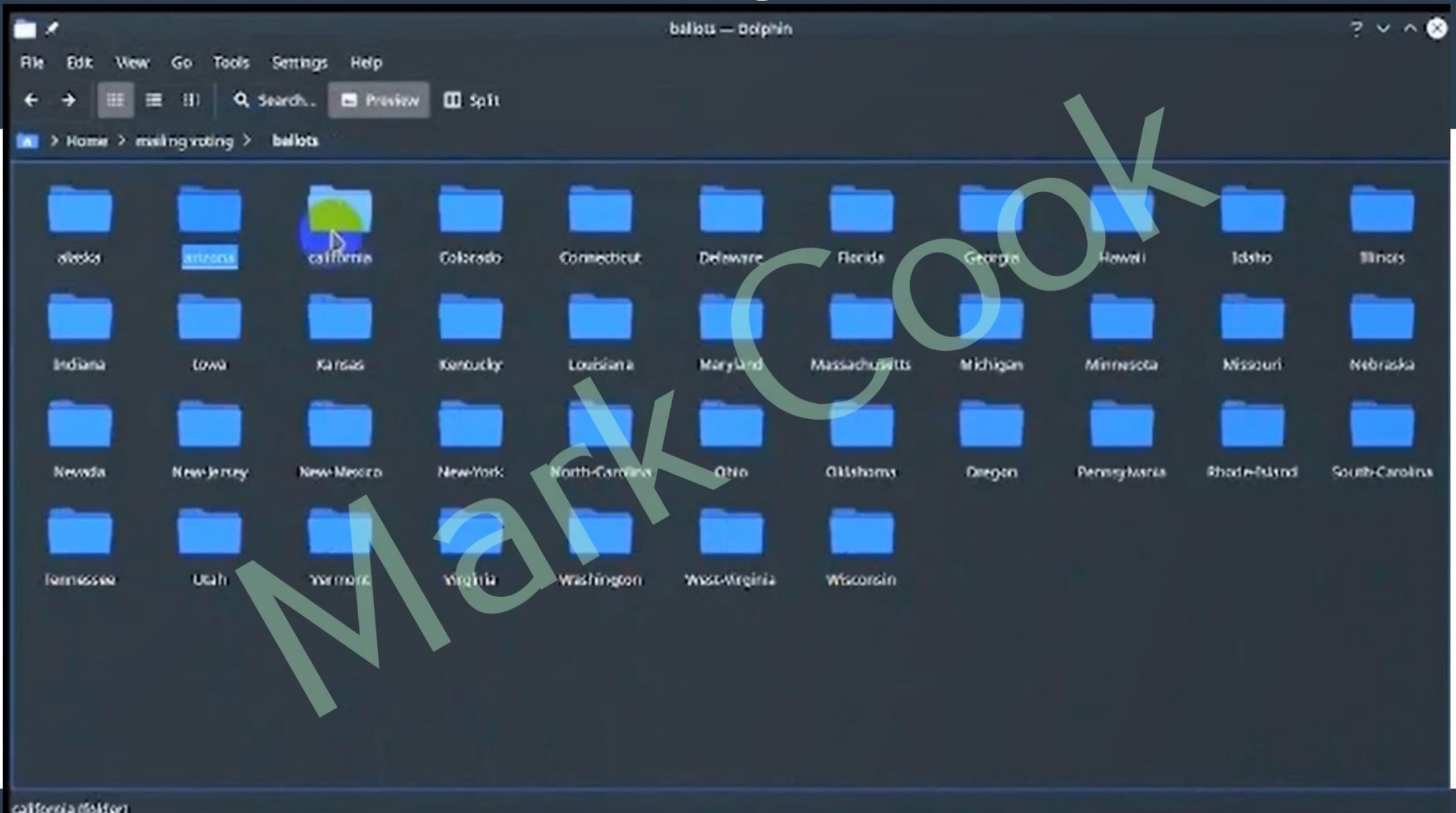

Collin County, TX – Voter list inconsistencies

The first issue is that months after an election, voters are removed from the State List. The example below comes from the State List of Voters for Collin County for the March 1, 2022 Primary Election. Notice that from May 29 to May 30 a couple from Plano was removed from the State list of voters. We checked with the County and they have confirmed that they in fact did vote. So what is happening in the State records for this couple to be removed months after the election?

The state has 2 instances of [redacted] and [redacted] in 2 different precincts - this is possible given name statistics, especially since their VUID are different - but it's the 4 names added that is a problem.

But why were these names:

Figure 2 comparing 5/3 to 6/10 for the March Primary – 2 duplicates but that might be OK, as it may be possible with suffixes, but there were also 4 names added over 2 months after the election.

Galveston County, TX – Voter list inconsistencies

And this issue does not just occur in Collin County.

Here is a chart from Galveston County. This chart was downloaded from the SOS website on July 2, 2022, and July 24, 2022 (four months after the primary). Notice that there are 2 votes removed from the Official Election Day Voting Information.

The election numbers should be a fixed set of names and VUIDs **at the time of certification**. Why are numbers and names changing months after the election? And who is doing this? Is there something in the system that makes these changes?

These data changes do not appear to be happening at the county level. So what is happening at the State level? The SOS website has a disclaimer that says that they do not alter or modify data provided by the county.

According to the above disclaimer, the State doesn't alter any information; therefore, there should NOT be changes at the State level that are not happening at the County level.

The deadline is Monday, October 5.

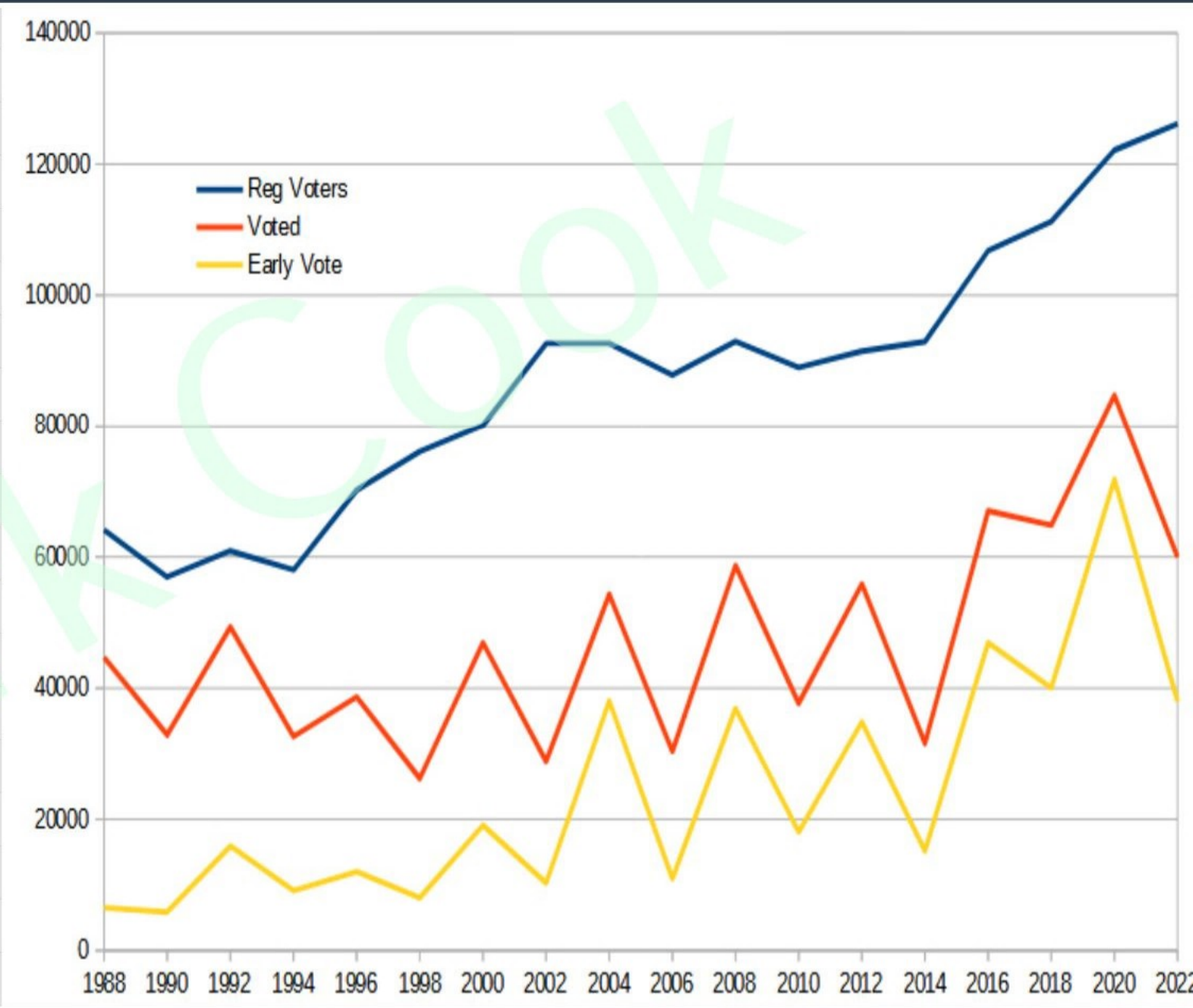
Brazos County now has a new record of more than 120,000 registered voters. Elections Administrator Trudy Hancock said Friday they've seen thousands of new voters added in recent weeks. The deadline to register is Monday and you'll need to know your driver's license number or the last four digits of your social security number. You don't have to present an ID to register.

"Every year we see people show up to the polls wanting to cast a ballot and they can't because they haven't registered and that's why it's very important to register before Monday," said David Hilburn, Chair of the Republican Party of Brazos County. He said their office is getting lots of calls.

"It's been a big uptick of people registering and whether that's just because of the presidential year or whether it's because of this specific election I don't know. You know as our population grows, it's natural to get people to move in. The numbers are going to go up," Hilburn added.

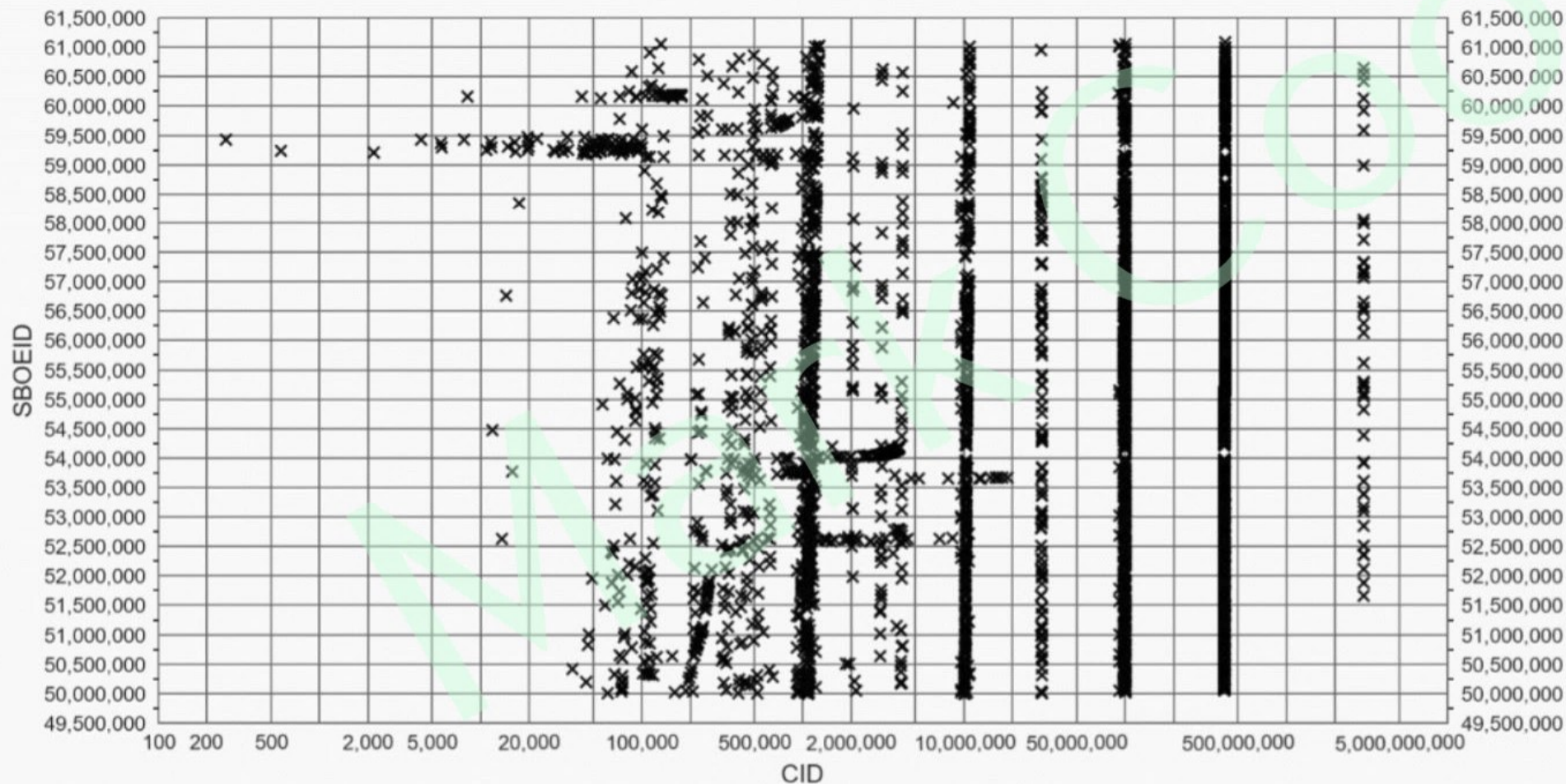

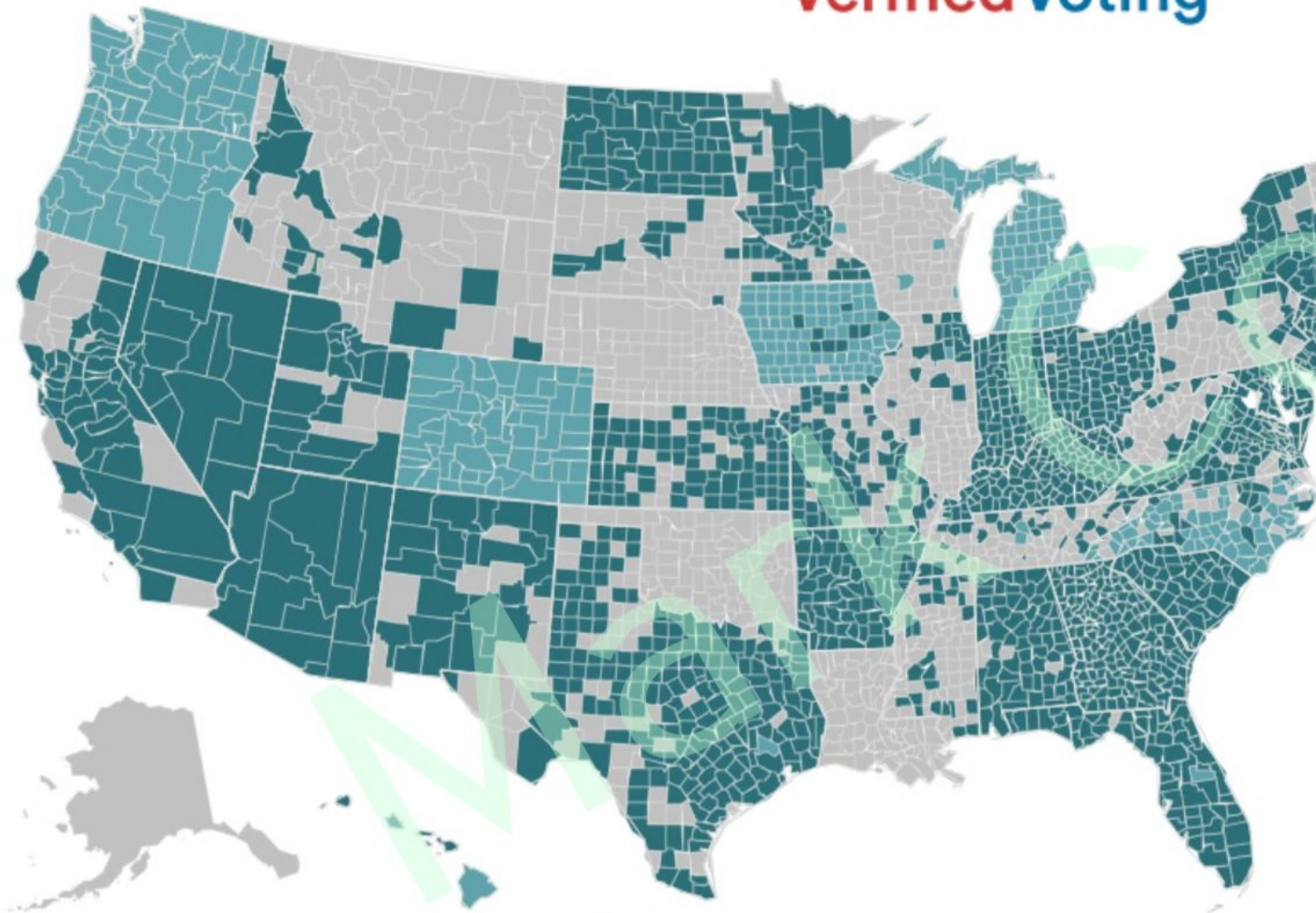

Brazos County, TX – Election ‘mistakes’

BRYAN, Texas (KBTX) - The Brazos County Elections Office has mailed 76 new mail-in ballots to voters who received ballots reflecting their old precincts. A total of 80 Brazos County residents received ballots reflecting their precincts before redistricting last, but four have now voted in person. The issue was brought to light Friday, Oct. 28, after a voter contacted the elections office saying they received the wrong ballot.

The issue is now being investigated by the Secretary of State's office since the database used to send out mail-in ballots is generated through it. Hancock said her team has gone through all 3,001 ballot by mail applications that have been approved, and no others besides the original 80 are inaccurate.

The 76 voters who haven't voted in person should receive new ballots in the next couple of days, according to Hancock.

"If you choose to vote in person instead of that ballot by mail, please take that ballot with you to the polling place," Hancock said. "You have to surrender that paper ballot at the voting facility to be able to vote in person."

For those who don't have their new ballots but want to vote in person now, you'll have to vote with a provisional ballot, according to Hancock. That ballot will not be counted immediately but will go to the early voting ballot board who'll look at it to ensure the mail-in ballot has not been returned. If that's the case, the provisional ballot will be accepted and counted.



The Clark County Election Department lowered the factory settings on its signature verification machine. So much for matching signatures as an impenetrable guard against election fraud.

That score is a “confidence level,” said Anthony Paiz, vice president of field services of Runbeck Election Services, which makes the machine. Paiz said his company recommends changes to that score are “done with bipartisan” buy-in.

That didn't happen in Clark County, where officials downgraded the confidence level to a 40 out of 100.

“To determine what score to use, we ran tests of the system and concluded that 40 would accept all the signatures that are obvious matches,” the spokesman said.

When asked if the “40” confidence level allowed inaccurate ballots to get through, the spokesman didn't respond by deadline. Registrar Joe Gloria

This is terrifying. Clark County is potentially the swing county in the swing state. It has tens of thousands of ballots floating around, legalized ballot harvesting and downgraded signature verification.

Did Clark County, Nevada use a defective signature-matching computer system in the 2020 election?

NO

In 2020, Clark County used a two-step process to verify voter signatures on mail-in ballots. The Agilis computerized scanning system reviewed signatures, accepting about 30%; additional human verification was used for the remaining 70%.

Republicans filed lawsuits challenging the county's signature verification process, which ultimately failed in both state and federal court.

A central claim of the lawsuits was that the Agilis system had a lower sensitivity setting than desired and should have accepted even fewer than 30% of signatures. Election officials testified that Agilis tested well at the setting used and that the county's ballot rejection rate was in line with the statewide signature rejection rate.

“The machine used in Clark County to verify signatures is called Agilis. And earlier this year, Clark County officials announced that they would need to lower the recommended factory tolerance settings on the Agilis machine in order to capture the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles' signature used to verify mail-in ballots. To match a ballot signature, the Agilis machine requires a clear signature on file with election officials that is scanned at a minimum resolution of 200 d.p.i. Nevertheless, the bulk of Clark County's signature files come from the Nevada DMV, which doesn't even have the capability of scanning signatures at that resolution. Knowing this, Clark County election officials still lowered the signature match threshold in order to capture blurry signatures and speed through the counting process. However, Artificial Intelligence experts and signature verification experts agree that changing the factory settings in this way will largely render the system useless.”

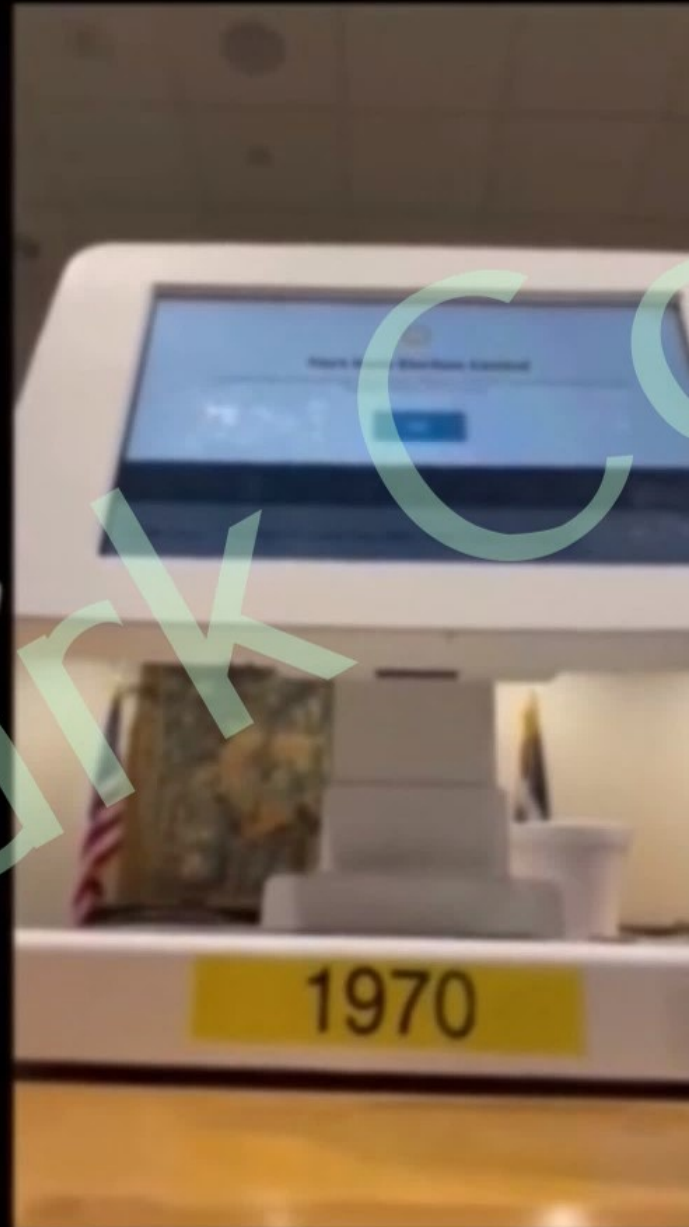

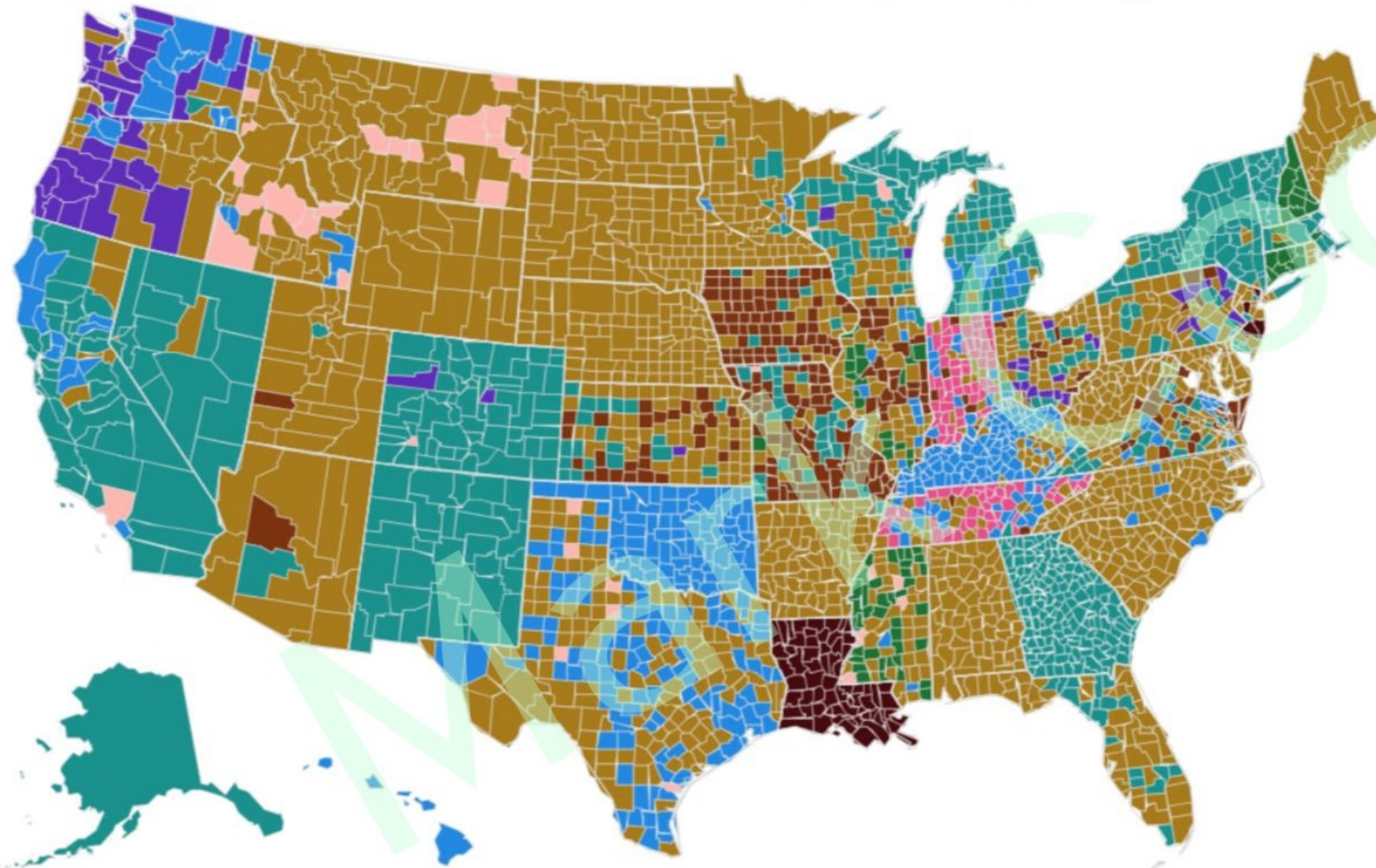

NBC News asked the two other major manufacturers how many of their tabulators with modems were currently in use. Hart said that it has approximately 1,600 such tabulators in use in 11 counties in Michigan. Dominion did not respond to numerous requests from NBC News for their sales numbers.

'Vulnerable to hacking'

With the 2020 presidential election only ten months away, Appel and Skoglund believe all modems can and should be removed from election systems.

"Modems in voting machines are a bad idea," said Appel. "Those modems that ES&S [and other manufacturers] are putting in their voting machines are network connections, and that leaves them vulnerable to hacking by anybody who can connect to that network."

The Key Objectives for this report were answered by this examination:

1. To determine whether D-Suite-implemented security requirements comply with the 2002 Voting System Standards (VSS)
 - a. Uncertified software was used on the system rendering the certification of the entire system and all elections conducted with it, Invalid.

 - c. **EACH of the compliance failures identified in 1.a. and 1.b. above are clear violations of the law.**

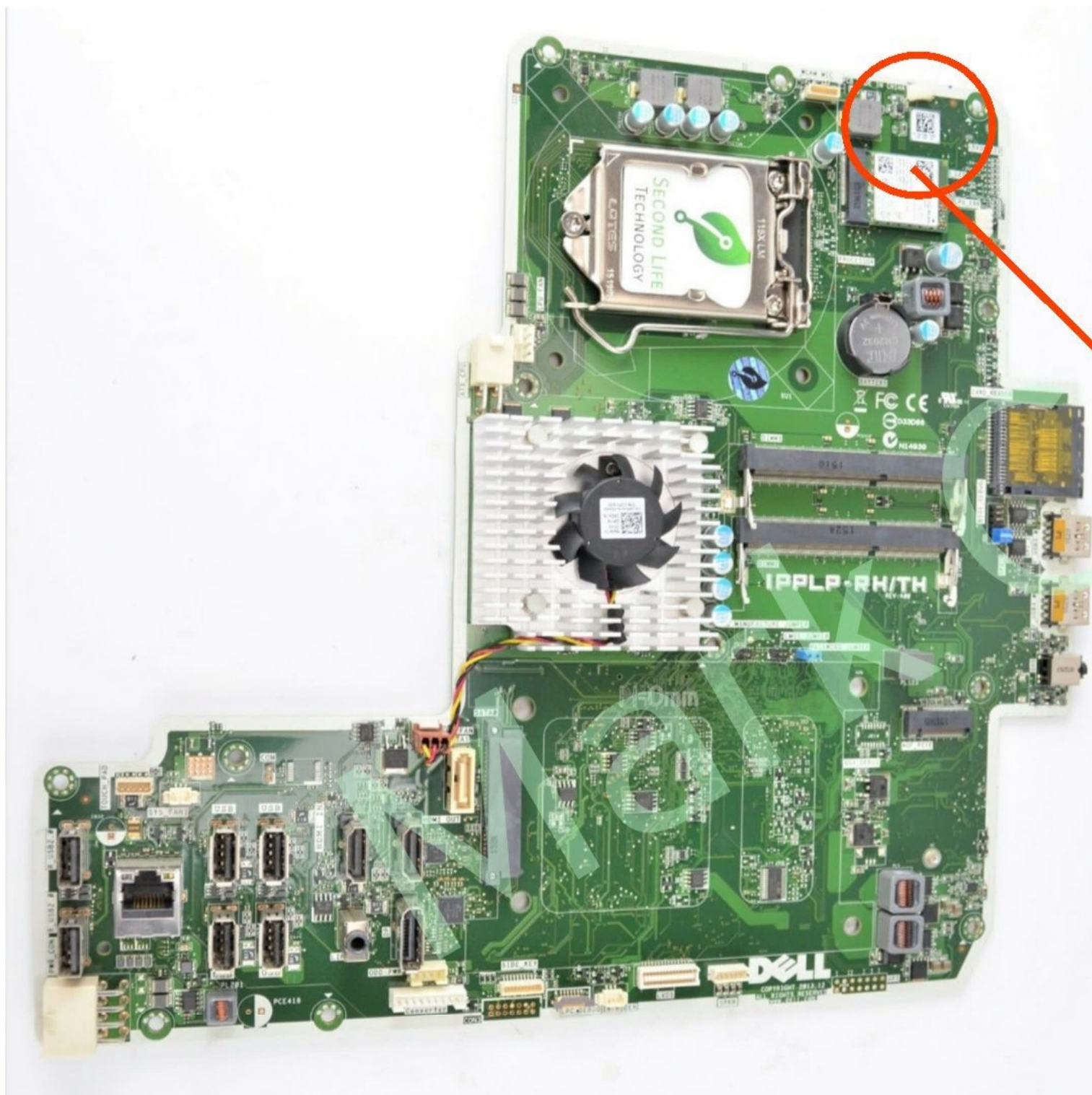

The discrepancy in a race for a county-level board of commissioners seat was blamed on a series of technical errors.

The candidate, Michelle Long Spears, was shortchanged by 3,792 votes in the District 2 primary for the Board of Commissioners in DeKalb County, Ga., that was held on May 24, according to newly-certified results released on Friday.

After conducting a [hand count](#) over the Memorial Day weekend and auditing those returns, election officials determined that they had drastically underreported the vote totals for Ms. Spears.

She received [43 percent of the vote](#), not 24 percent, as reported by an [unofficial and incomplete election summary posted on May 25 on the county's website](#). As the top vote-getter, Ms. Spears qualified for a June 21 runoff against the second-place candidate, Lauren Alexander.

“I hope that this never happens to another candidate, in another race ever again,” Ms. Spears said. “It has been a nightmare.”

Election officials attributed the discrepancy to a series of technical and human errors, which they characterized as being isolated to the primary race.

They said that the problems, which they described as a computer programming error, began when a fourth candidate withdrew from the race late — 135 votes were cast for that former candidate. A redistricting error compounded the situation, according to the county.

"I want to be as transparent as I can possibly be to the citizens of Cherokee County. And, I don't want them to ever have to think that there's anything to worry about when it comes to elections in this office," said Rebecca Brassart, Cherokee County Clerk.

The County Clerk is now going through all of the thumb drives to make sure all the other races in the county and at the state-level are correct.

Figure 8 - EMS Server (5.11-CO) Web Server Log Files Before

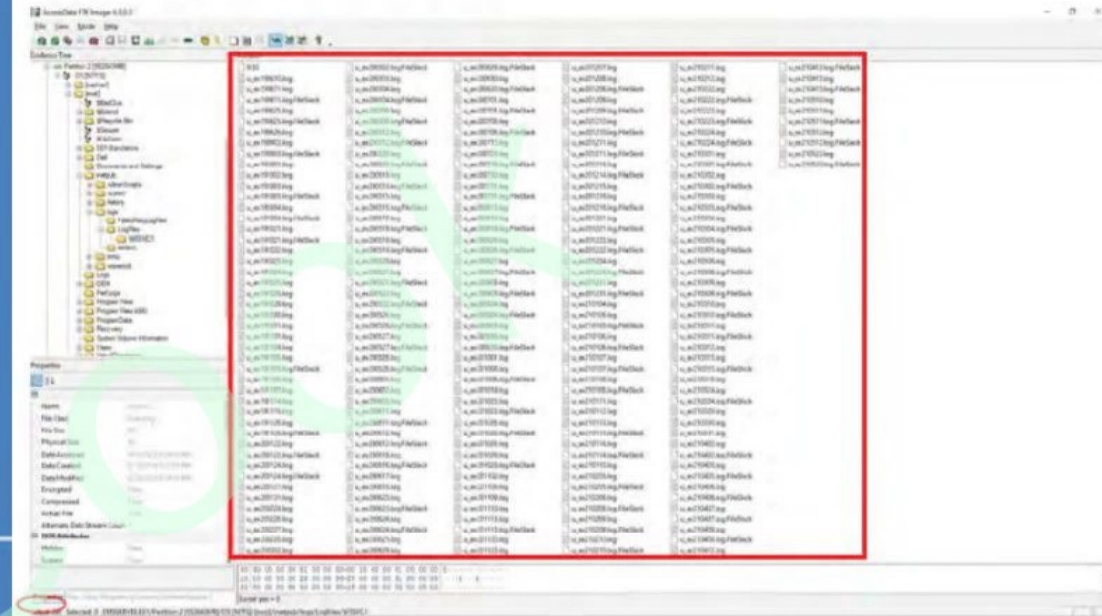
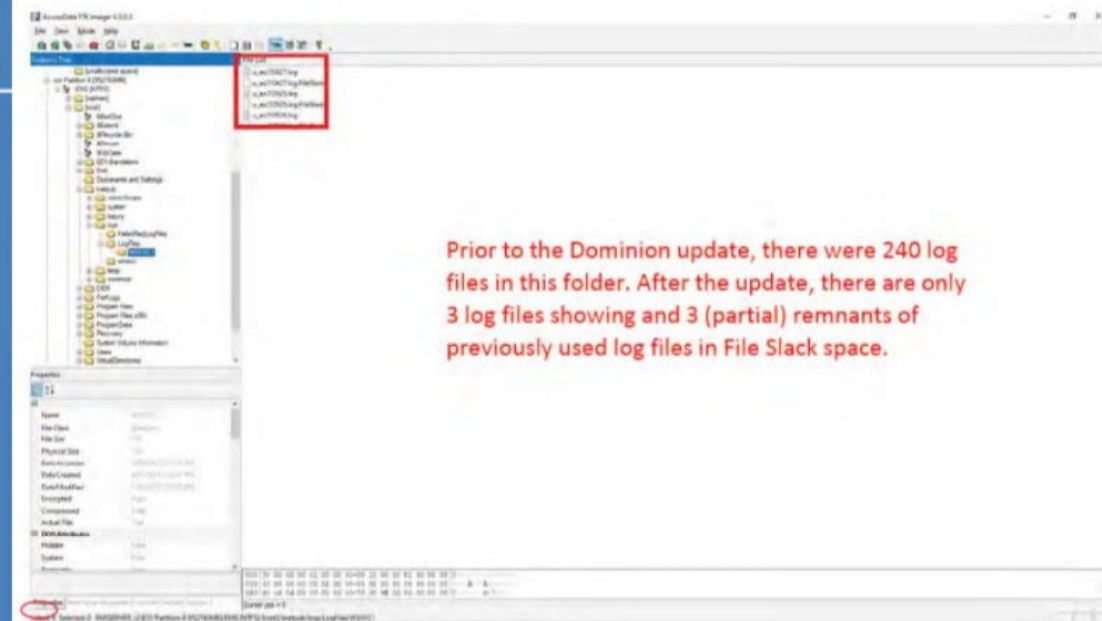


Figure 9 - EMS Server (5.13) Web Server Log Files After

Conclusions

While the 4.14.A.1 build of the Democracy Voting System proved to mitigate four previously enumerated vulnerabilities, multiple medium and high vulnerabilities still exist within the suite of systems. A remote user could leverage most of the vulnerabilities across the network to obtain information about the system, voter ballots and results, or gain remote access to the system.

If remote access is gained, recovery of user credentials through system memory (RAM) analysis could be executed and used to modify the backend database of the EMS Server.

The Partial Manual Count (PMC) is a post-election audit of the electronic voting system used in an election to ensure the accuracy of the tabulation of the votes.⁴⁸⁹ The PMC involves a manual count of all the races in at least one percent of the election precincts or in three precincts (whichever is greater) in which the electronic voting system was used.⁴⁹⁰ The PMC must be conducted after every election that uses paper ballots that are counted with an electronic voting system. A REGULATION relating to elections; setting forth requirements for **risk**-limiting audits of the 2022 Primary and General Elections; establishing certain deadlines for submitting and posting the results of a **risk**-limiting audit that is conducted beginning January 1, 2024; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The Risk-Limiting Audit Scam

3. A **risk**-limiting audit conducted pursuant to this section must audit the results of:

(a) One race for statewide office. The Secretary of State will randomly select one race for statewide office to be audited at the election using a method determined by the Secretary of State in which all races for statewide office on the ballot at the election have an equal chance of being selected. The Secretary of State will notify each county clerk which race for statewide office has been selected for the **risk**-limiting audit at least 15 days before the date of the election.

The Risk-Limiting Audit Scam

(b) One race for countywide office. Each county clerk conducting a risk-limiting audit of an election shall randomly select one race for countywide office to be audited at the election using a method determined by the county clerk in which all races for countywide office on the ballot at the election have an equal chance of being selected. The county clerk must notify the Secretary of State which race for countywide office has been selected for the risk-limiting audit at least 15 days before the date of the election.

The Risk-Limiting Audit Scam

Secretary of State:

- (a) Will require the use of risk-limiting audit software with the risk limit set at 5 percent;*
 - and*
 - (b) May designate one or more of the following types of audit methods:*
 - (1) Ballot comparison;*
 - (2) Ballot polling; or*
 - (3) A hybrid of ballot comparison and ballot polling.*
- 8. As used in this section:*

The Risk-Limiting Audit Scam

(a) “Ballot comparison” means a technique used in a risk-limiting audit in which the results of the ballot polling are compared to the results of the mechanical voting system as set forth in the record of votes cast on the system.

(b) “Ballot polling” means a technique used in a risk-limiting audit in which individual paper ballots are randomly selected and the ballot markings are examined and interpreted manually until the sampling of selected paper ballots indicates a sufficient majority for the reported winner of the election.

Summit County was one of two out of 29 counties in Utah that experienced delays in election night reporting, causing preliminary results to go unreleased after 11:40 p.m. Tuesday.

Duchesne County also hadn't released preliminary results. Wasatch County was also delayed, but began reporting shortly before 11:30 p.m.

The Summit County delays were the result of careful tabulation by the county clerk's office, according to Eve Furse, the county clerk. Several County Courthouse races, including county attorney, sheriff and clerk, allowed for write-in candidates and took additional time to count.

Some officials in the Summit County Republican Party claimed mail-in ballots during the midterm elections would not result in a free and fair election. Now an audit of the Lieutenant Governor's office found no signs of systematic problems.

Utah has conducted mail-in voting for more than a decade and this year's midterm elections were no different. What was different this year were questions from some officials about the integrity of the voting process.

Last December, Utah's legislative leaders ordered an audit of the 2022 election. That deep dive into the election process and Lieutenant Governor Deidre Henderson's office found no evidence of fraud, widespread errors or systematic problems during this year's midterm elections.

Furthermore, auditors found that security systems already in place would foil any attempts to tamper with ballots.

Henderson said in a statement that the systems in place are the result of careful and deliberate efforts by the Legislature over many years to ensure that Utah voters have access to ballots, confidence in the security of elections and the ability to hold those who run elections accountable for their performance.

However, independent investigators pointed out several areas that need improvement, such as updating voter registration rolls and standardizing signature verification.

Summit County Clerk Eve Furse said she's very pleased that the legislative audit found that Utah's elections safeguards are in place and working.

Summit County Republican Party Chair Karen Ballash was vocal about election integrity during the midterms. In September, she emailed her party members claiming that mail-in ballots and machines wouldn't result in a free and fair process. Ballash did not respond to KPCW's request for comment.

Tim Gallagher is a Summit County Republican Party precinct captain. He said it's not surprising that the Legislature found no fraud. He said he has complete faith in the election process.

On Thursday, Georgia's 159 counties [finalized a hand recount](#), technically an audit, of the five million ballots cast in the election, reaffirming Joseph R. Biden Jr.'s victory but reducing his lead by more than 1,200 votes.

Georgia's secretary of state, Brad Raffensperger, a Republican, had [ordered the manual audit](#) as part of a new state law to ensure the accuracy of voting machines by comparing paper ballot counts with machine tallies. This was not an official recount, though the Trump campaign can choose to request one after the state's results are certified this week, as the vote margin between Mr. Biden and President Trump is below 0.5 percentage points.

In many counties, officials conducting the audit found [zero or single-digit differences](#) in their counts, and they will not change their original results for the state certification process. Yet at least four counties — Douglas, Fayette, Floyd and Walton — discovered missed ballots and will add these to their original counts.

In Douglas, Fayette and Walton Counties, the counting of paper ballots revealed that election workers had undercounted votes after missing memory cards, which held machine-cast votes. New voting machines adopted by the state in 2019 allow voters to use touchscreens to print ballots. The voters then verify the ballots and formally cast them by scanning, resulting in a paper record and a machine tally.

Floyd County officials discovered about 2,400 ballots that election workers neglected to rescan after a scanner failed and results could not be retrieved from memory cards. Officials attributed the error to "gross incompetence" on the part of the county's elections director.

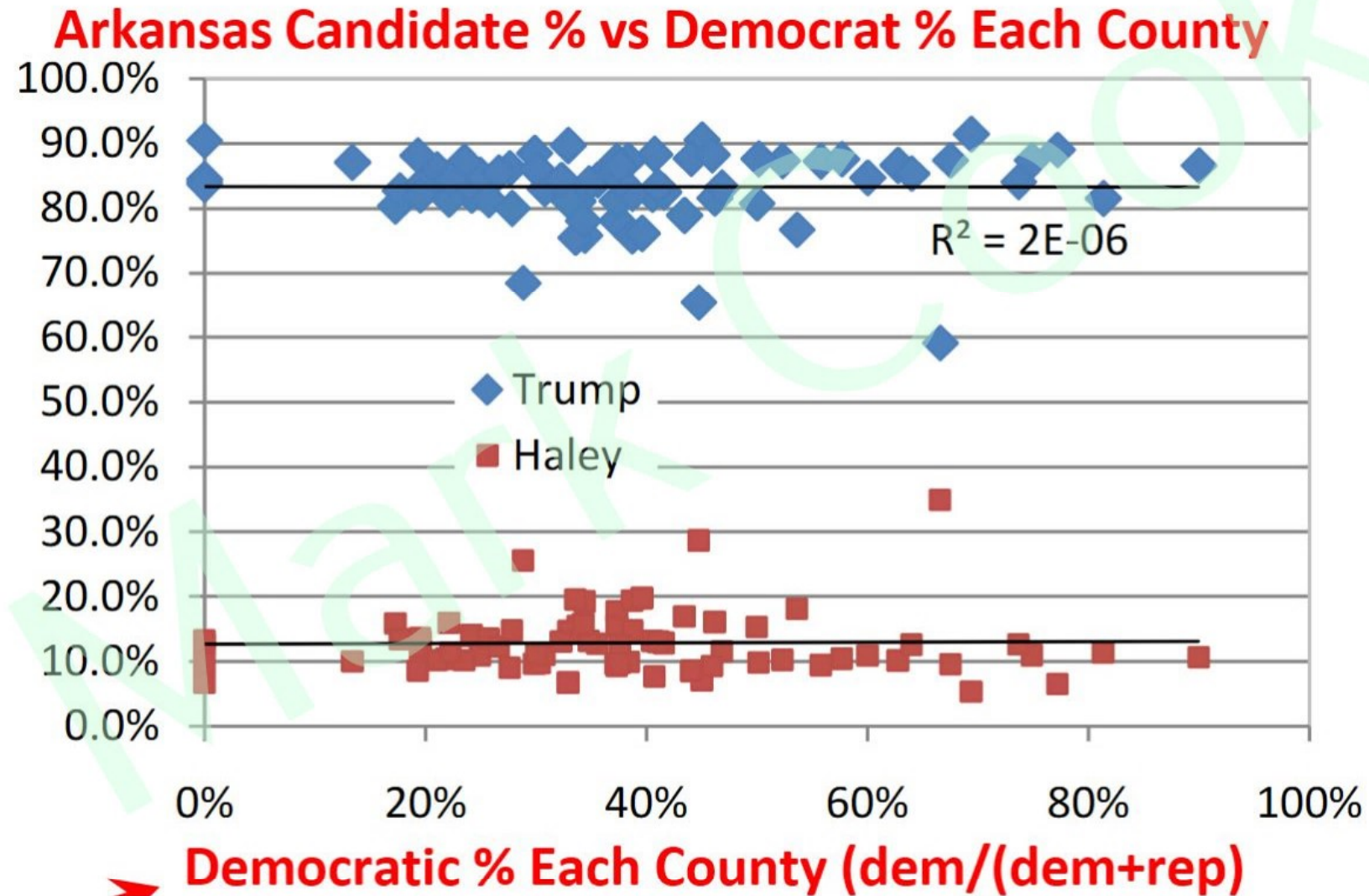
Despite the errors in these four counties, election officials have said that there are [no signs of voter fraud](#) and that the new system is working as intended.

"These people are operating in it under the highest level of stress, in the most contentious election in their work life in the United States and in Georgia. So for the most part they are doing a really good job on this," said Gabriel Sterling, Georgia's statewide voting system implementation manager.

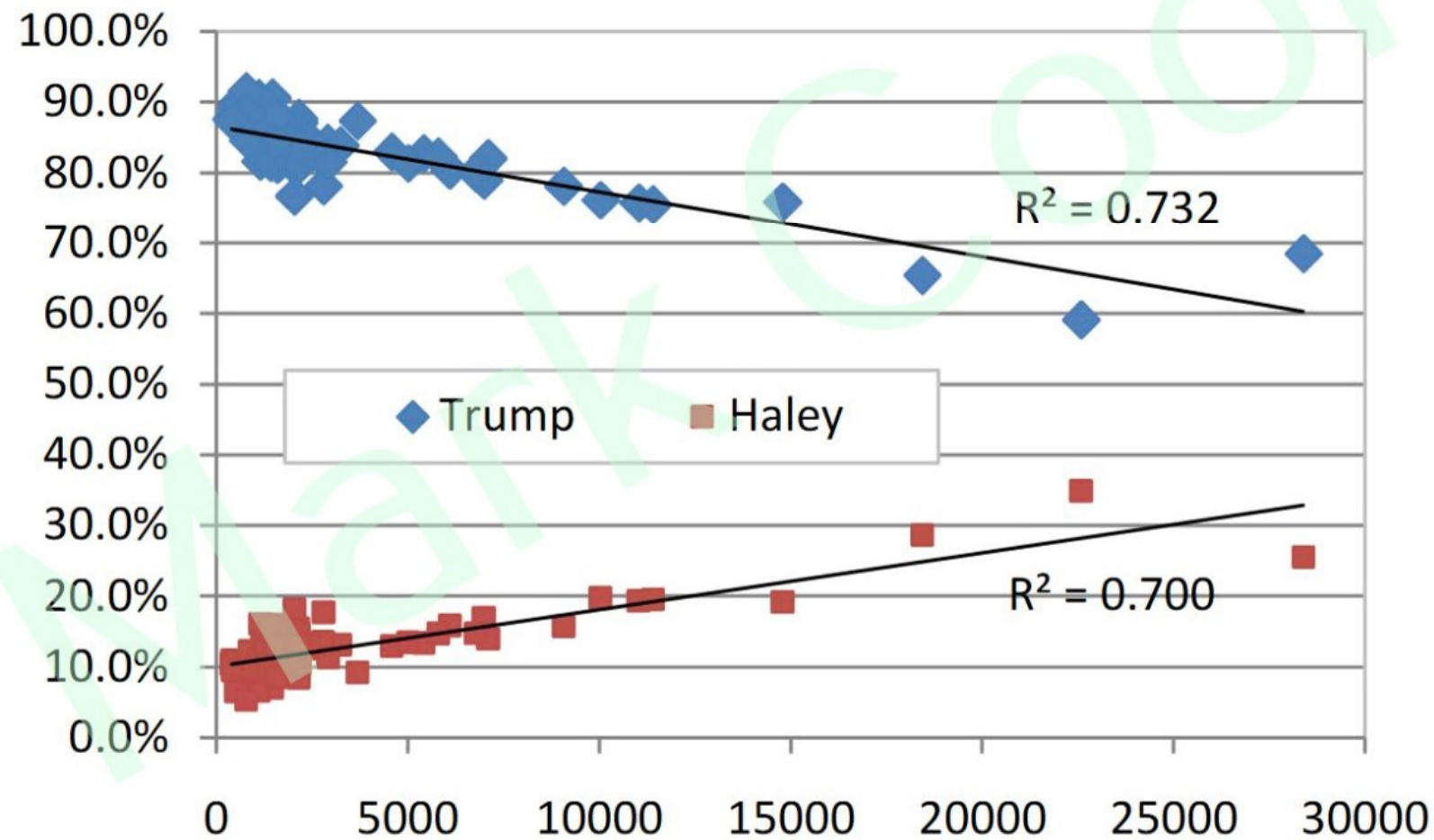

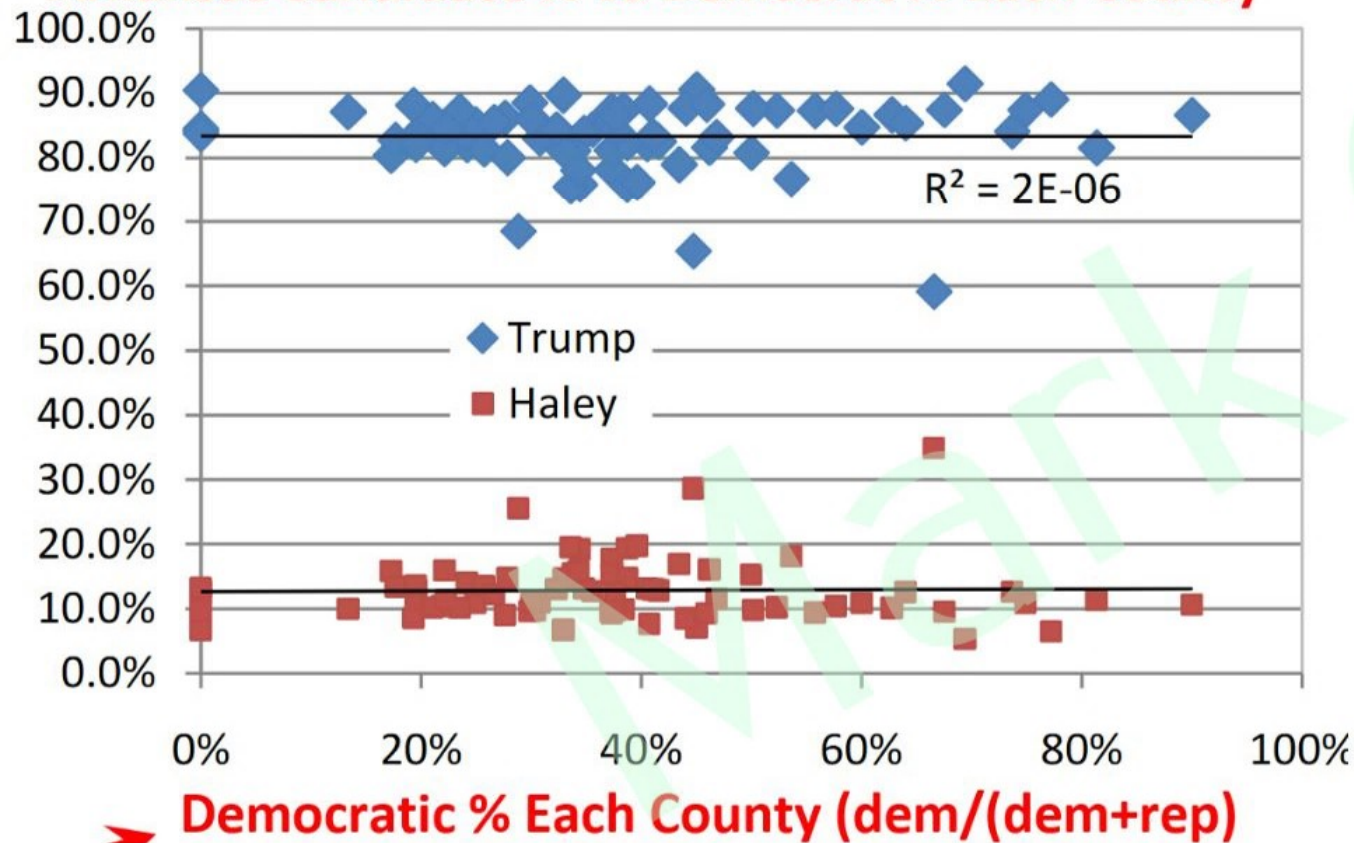

Arkansas- Candidate% vs # of Votes Each County

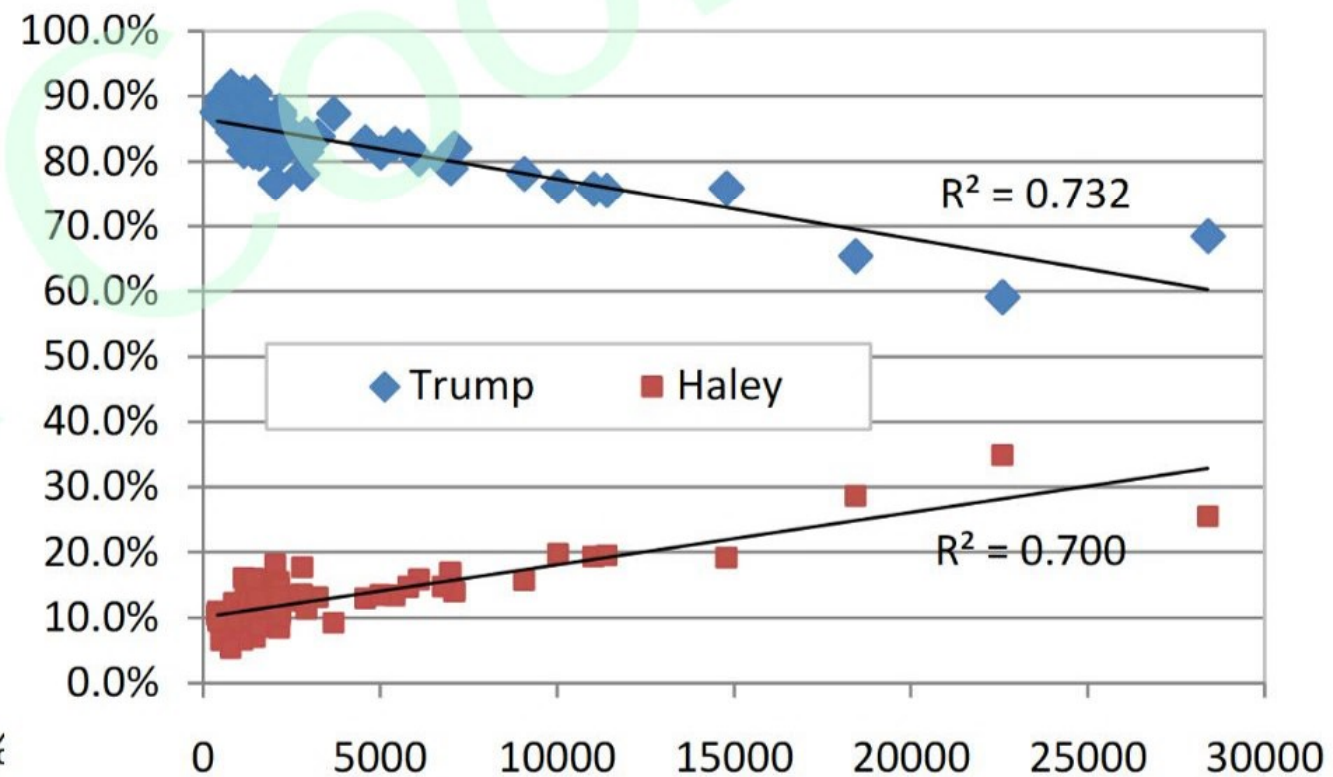

For the second time this year, Tarrant County will have a new elections administrator.

Heider Garcia, elections manager in Placer County, Calif., has been hired to guide and oversee local elections.

He should join the county in mid-February to observe the March 6 primary election and help out as needed, Tarrant County Judge **Glen Whitley** said.

"We think he will be a good fit," Whitley said.

Garcia will be sworn in as elections administrator after the primary.

The delay is to give him time to become a registered voter in Tarrant County, which Whitley said he must do before he can be sworn in.

He replaces **Nathan Neblett**, a Houston man who held the post for two weeks in January before county officials decided to "release" him from the post.

"We just decided it wasn't going to be a good fit for us," Whitley [said at the time](#). "We decided to go in a different direction."

New voting machines in Tarrant County

September 3, 2019

Tarrant County voters will be casting ballots on new machines for this year's Nov. 5 constitutional amendment election. County Commissioners recently signed off on an \$11 million plan to buy this new equipment, part of Austin-based Hart InterCivic's Verity line.

These machines, approved for use by the Texas Secretary of State's office, include a paper trail.

Voters will use a touchscreen to review the ballot and make their choices. The machine will print a list of the candidates chosen. After reviewing votes on the sheet, voters must put their paper ballot into one of the scanners to formally cast their vote and drop it into the ballot box.

Tarrant County Elections Administrator Heider Garcia has asked the state to allow countywide vote centers — which would let voters cast ballots at any polling place in the county on Election Day — as soon as the November election.

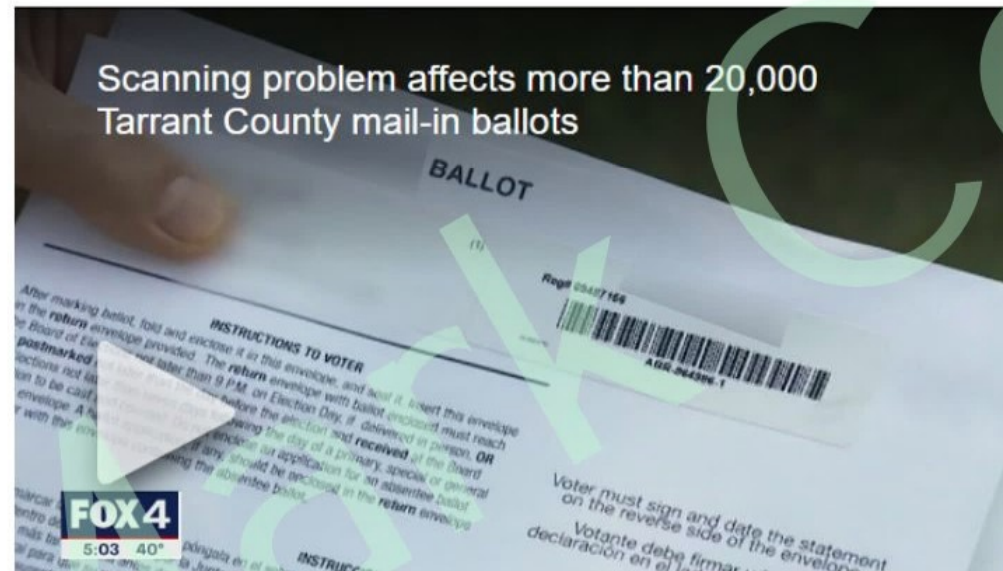

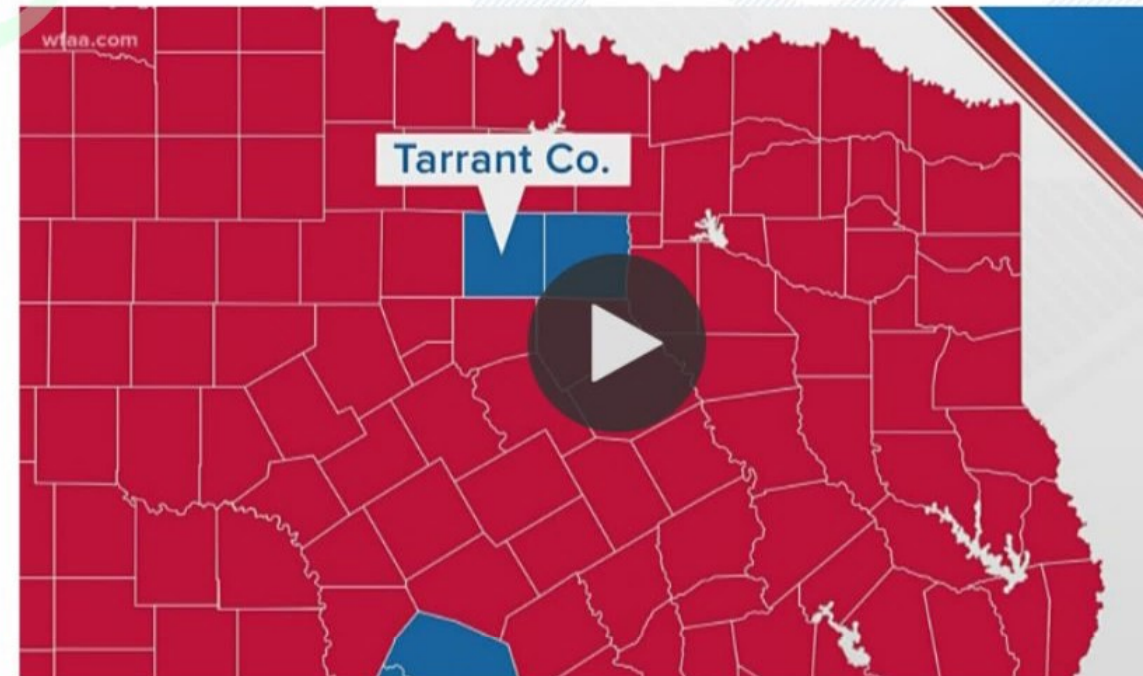

The Tarrant County GOP is quite agitated the county has been cast as “blue” after the Nov. 3 general election. Heider Garcia, a lauded Texas election official who resigned as elections director in Tarrant County under political pressure last spring, is set to become Dallas County's next elections chief.

Garcia's first day will be Dec. 20, Dallas County officials said during an election commission meeting Wednesday.

The announcement comes two weeks after Michael Scarpello, who has been Dallas County elections administrator since 2020, submitted his resignation and said he'd be retiring after working in elections in various jurisdictions across the country for more than 20 years. Scarpello's last day will be Dec. 19.

"I am honored," Garcia said in a text message Wednesday, after his appointment. "I'll be very humble in my new role and work really hard to follow in Michael's footsteps. Dallas deserves the best and I intend to work with that goal in mind."

Garcia, one of the most respected elections directors in the state during his time in Tarrant, had been Tarrant County's elections administrator since 2018. Since former President Donald Trump began to make baseless allegations of fraud in connection with the outcome of the 2020 election, Tarrant County — the state's most populous swing county — has been at the center of unfounded election fraud conspiracies.

Garcia, who previously worked as a software engineer for the voting machine company Smartmatic in Venezuela, also became the subject of allegations from some voter fraud activists and Trump allies who claimed he'd "rigged" the Tarrant election. Fringe activists began posting Garcia's home address online. He faced harassment and racist death threats.

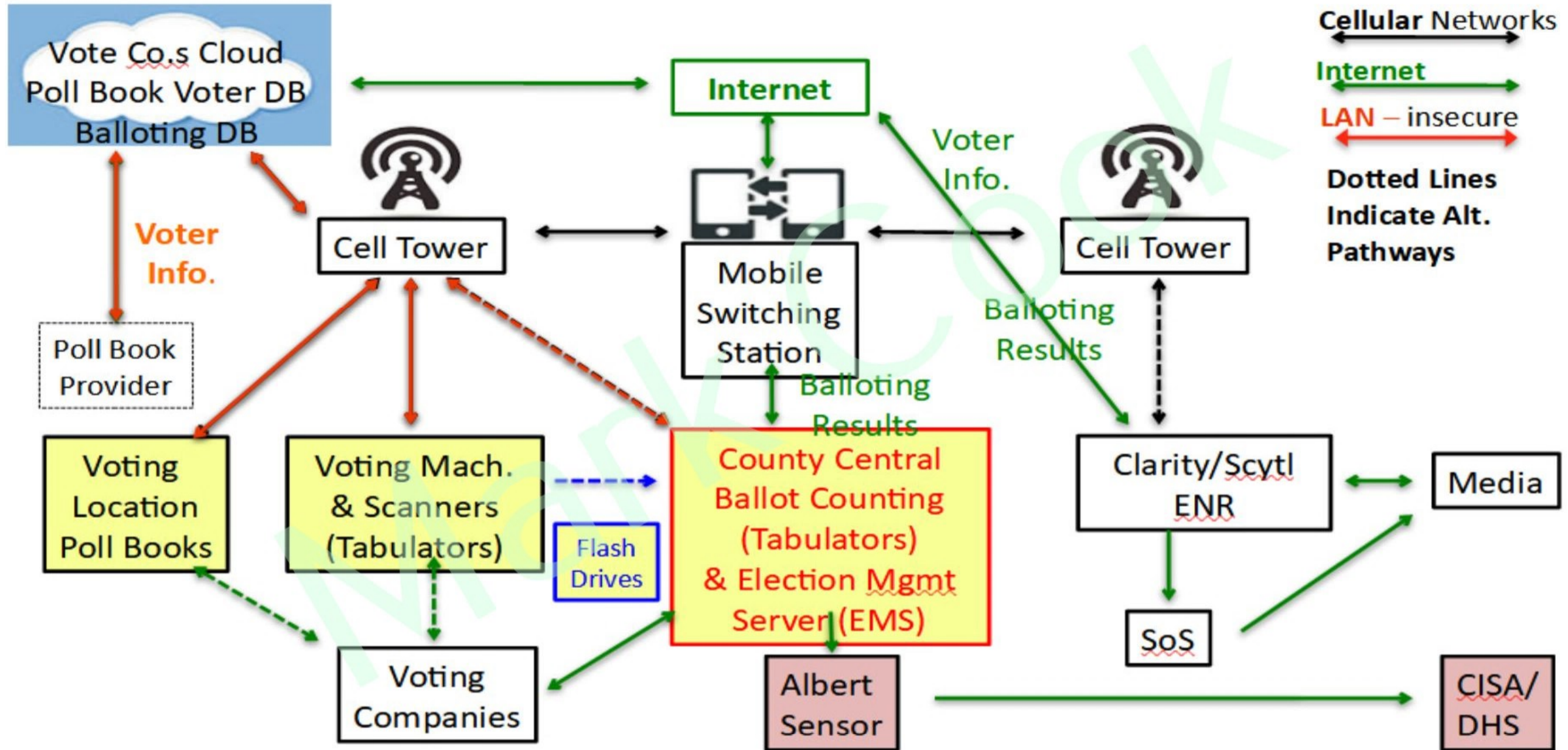

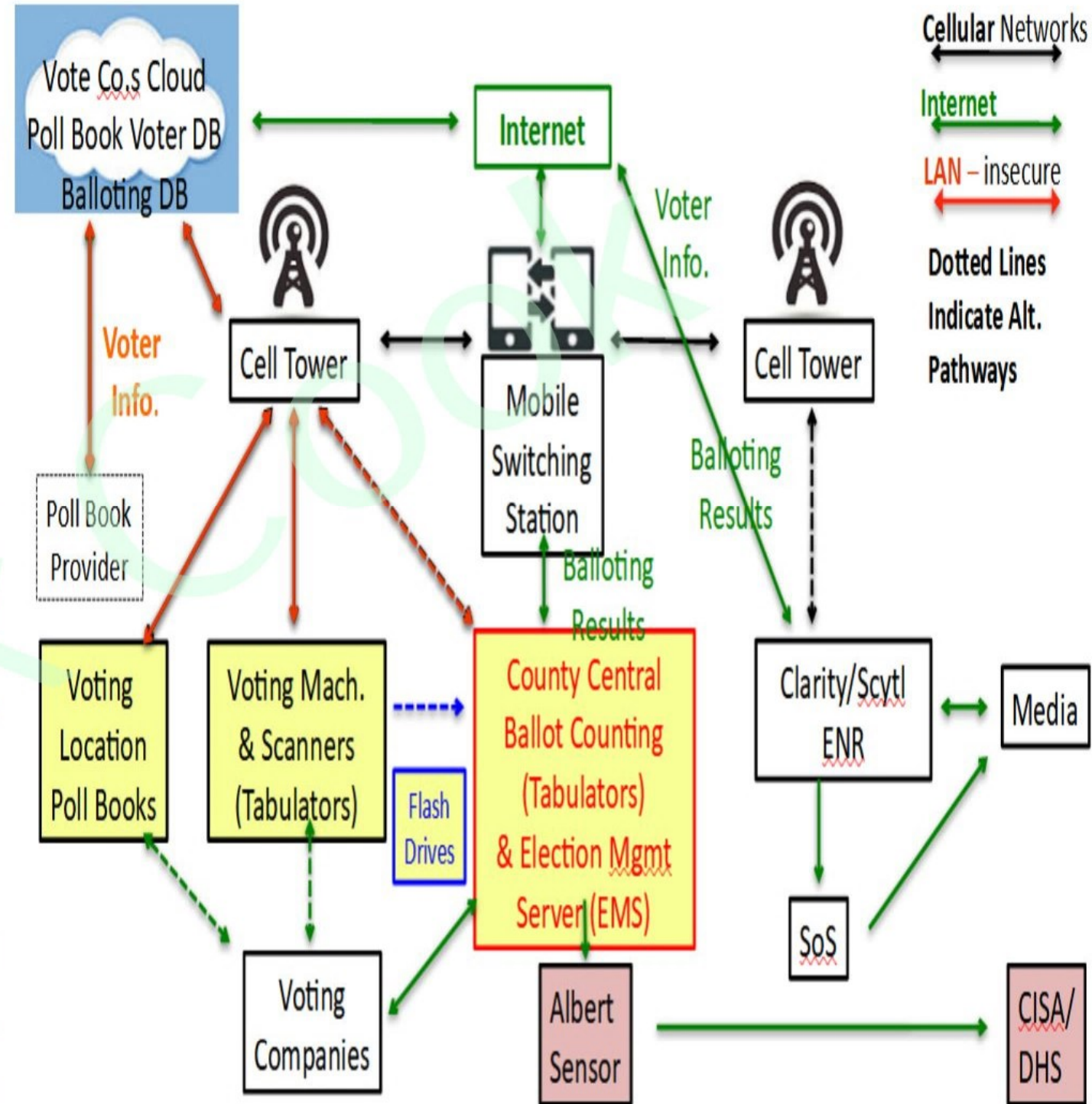

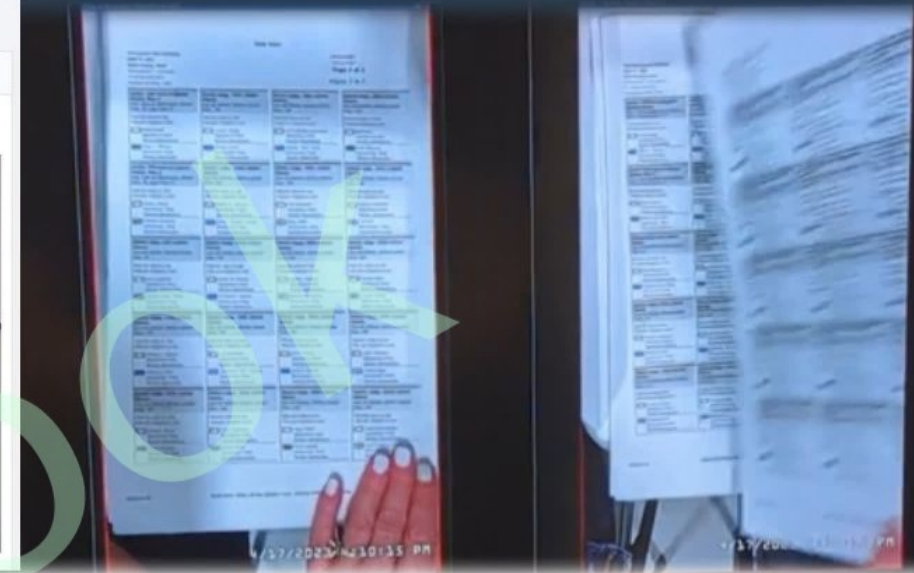
